Fearon Hall is situated in a conservation area close to Loughborough town centre. Located on the Parish Green adjacent to the Parish Church two minutes' drive (traffic permitting) from the A6 ring road.

There will be no parking available at the Hall – there is one disabled space available on a first come, first served basis. Please do not park on Rectory Road as it is residents permit parking only. There is other on-street parking nearby but as this is restricted we recommend you use The Rushes car park which is a 5-minute walk away through Steeple Row and the Parish Green.

Taylor's is located in a residential area, so there is a limited amount of free on-street parking around the foundry. Free parking is typically available on the surrounding streets. It is within easy walking distance of the town centre.

The nearest railway station is Loughborough, a short walk from both the Fearon Hall and Taylors. Taxis are available at the station.

## Saturday/Sunday lunch

You can pre-book an optional 'grab bag' lunch on campus as part of your conference booking. This will consist of a filled roll plus crisps, a cookie, a piece of fruit and a snack bar at a cost of £8.50 per delegate. Please include details of any dietary requirements/allergies with your booking.
